Working for Virginia's Law Enforcement

Championed legislation to reduce gang violence.

Randy reintroduced a bill to expand federal criminal penalties for gang crimes and to allow the Attorney General to designate "high intensity gang activity areas" in order to direct resources where needed (H.R. 2857).

Increased funding to hire and train more officers in the Fourth Congressional District.

Randy voted to increase funding for state and local law enforcement agencies to hire new officers and prosecutors, purchase new technology, and develop anti-drug task forces. (H.R. 1139).

Opposed the pre-trial release of sexual predators.

Randy cosponsored legislation to prevent states from receiving federal funding for criminal justice programs unless the states certify that their laws provide adequate protection against the pre-trial release of individuals charged with certain violent or serious sex crimes (H.R. 2674).

Supported sex offender registration.

Randy supported the establishment of a public registry with information on individuals convicted of a criminal offense against a minor and on violent predators who victimize children (H.R. 1422).

Introduced legislation to protect the right of retired officers to conceal and carry.

Randy introduced legislation to make it easier for retired law enforcement officers to carry concealed weapons (H.R. 3752).
